Education Counts

Education Counts on edCentre (*Education Counts*) was developed to simplify access to quantitative education information for Ministry of Education clients. Consultation with users of education information identified the need for an online space for them to access statistical data, quantitative information, and research about the education sector.

Objectives

The objectives of *Education Counts* are:

- create an effective online “doorway” to statistical data, quantitative information, and research on education and education services in New Zealand
- ensure all information is presented in a clear and cogent way
- offer ways for clients to obtain additional information, including making specific information requests
- provide a clear pathway to the edCentre portal
- provide a clear pathway to www.minedu.govt.nz and other Ministry of Education, and Ministry supported, websites.

It is hoped that clear definitions of the data cube’s measures and dimensions will assist with using of the data.

Audiences

Members from all the Ministry of Education’s audiences visit *Education Counts*; however, the main focus is on visitors from any audience wanting statistical data, quantitative information, and research on education and education services in New Zealand. Audiences of particular high use are:

- researchers
- education providers
- Ministry of Education analysts
- government agencies
- governance bodies
- sector interest groups.

Early Leaving Exemptions

Rationale

In order to achieve, students must stay at school, experience a sense of belonging and support, and stay interested and engaged in learning. All schools face the constant challenge of ensuring that all students feel they belong and are encouraged to participate at school. This is the foundation of motivation, interest and pleasure in learning.

A key indicator of continuing engagement with school is retention - the proportion of students who continue to attend school beyond the point at which it is compulsory to do so. School is compulsory for all students aged from 6 to their 16th birthday. However, parents of students aged 15 years-old may apply to the Ministry of Education for an exemption from schooling on the basis of educational problems, conduct, or the unlikelihood of the student gaining benefit from attending available schools. Parents are required to give details about training programmes or employment that the student would move on to in the event of an exemption being granted.

These young people leaving school without qualifications may have difficulty performing in the workforce and may face difficulties in terms of life-long learning, or returning to formal study in later years.

A considerable number of research studies also show that there is a strong correlation between early school leavers and unemployment and/or lower incomes, which are in turn generally related to poverty and dependence on income support. In New Zealand, recent data show that those with no qualifications have unemployment rates far exceeding those with qualifications, and the lowest median incomes.

Data cubes

There are two early leaving exemption data cubes; one data cube is at 'school level', while the other is at 'demographic level'.

The school level data cube is called "Early leaving exemptions by school" and contains the two measures Early Leaving Exemptions and Students with the following dimensions:

- Calendar Year
- Destination
- School
- School Gender
- School Region
- School Socio-Economic Decile (sub-dimension of Quintile)
- School Socio-Economic Quintile
- School Territorial Local Authority
- School Type (School sector)
- School Urban Classification.

The demographic level data cube is called “Early leaving exemptions by ethnic group and gender” and contains the two measures Early Leaving Exemptions and Students with the following dimensions:

- Calendar Year
- Destination
- Ethnic Group
- Gender
- School Gender
- School Region
- School Socio-Economic Decile (sub-dimension of Quintile)
- School Socio-Economic Quintile
- School Territorial Local Authority
- School Type (School sector)
- School Urban Classification.

Frequency of updates

Early leaving exemption data are collected regularly throughout the school year. Each May the previous year’s data is archived and used to populate the data cube.

The numbers of 15 year-old students, used as a denominator, are sourced from the July schools roll returns and are as at 1 July.

Measures

Early Leaving Exemptions

Name in data cube:	Early Leaving Exemptions
Definition:	The number of students receiving an early leaving exemption.
Context:	<p>Under Section 22 of the Education Act 1989, parents of students aged 15 years-old may apply to the Ministry of Education for an exemption from schooling on the basis of educational problems, conduct, or the unlikelihood of the student gaining benefit from attending available schools. Parents are required to give details about training programmes or employment that the student would move on to in the event of an exemption being granted.</p> <p>NZAID students (foreign students sponsored by the New Zealand Agency for International Development – a branch of MFAT) and foreign fee paying students are excluded as generally they have a visa to come to a specific school and study, and granting an early leaving exemption would invalidate the visa.</p>
Source:	The early leaver request form submitted to the local office of the Ministry of Education.

Students

Name in data cube:	Students
Definition:	The number of 15 year-old domestic students as at 1 July for each year.
Context:	Only students aged 15 years-old may receive an early leaver exemption. This measure is used as a denominator to compare different population groups. NZAID students (foreign students sponsored by the New Zealand Agency for International Development – a branch of MFAT) and foreign fee paying students are excluded.
Source:	July schools roll returns.

Calendar Year

Name in data cube:	Calendar Year
Definition:	<p>For the early leaving exemption measure it is the year the early leaving exemption was granted.</p> <p>For the students measure it is the year they were 15 years-old as at 1 July.</p>
Values:	2000; 2001; 2002; 2003; 2004; 2005.
Context:	
Source:	<p>For the early leaving exemptions measure it is the early leaver request form submitted to the local office of the Ministry of Education.</p> <p>For the students measure it is the July schools roll returns.</p>

Destination

Name in data cube:	Destination
Definition:	The intended destination of student after receiving an early leaving exemption.
Values:	Full time employment; Polytech course; Training Provider course; University course; and Other.
Context:	
Source:	The early leaver request form submitted to the local office of the Ministry of Education.

Ethnic Group

Name in data cube:	Ethnic_group
Definition:	The prioritised ethnicity of each student.
Values:	Māori; Pasifika; Asian; Other; and NZ European.
Context:	<p>Prioritised ethnicity is where each record is allocated to a single ethnic group using the priority system (Māori, Pasifika, Asian, Other and NZ European). If an enrolment has ethnicities of Pasifika and NZ European recorded, the single ethnicity assigned to the record based on the prioritisation process will be Pasifika. The aim of prioritisation is to ensure that where some need exists to assign people to a single ethnic group, ethnic groups of policy importance, or of small size, are not swamped by the NZ European ethnic group.</p> <p>For the early leaving exemptions measure ethnicity is supplied by the school. For the student measure ethnicity is supplied by the student's parent or guardian.</p> <p>For each year, there were at least 10% of student early leaving exemptions for which no ethnicity code had been recorded. The distribution of cases with non-missing ethnic codes, for each year and school, has been applied to the set of students with no ethnicity code so as to equate numbers by ethnic group with the total numbers of cases. For schools where all cases had 'Unspecified' ethnicity, the distribution of cases across all schools has been used. For this reason, all comparisons by ethnicity should be regarded as estimates only.</p> <p>As a result of the above manipulation it is possible to get non-integer values for early leaving exemptions when considering ethnic groups.</p>
Source:	<p>For the early leaving exemptions measure it is the early leaver request form submitted to the local office of the Ministry of Education.</p> <p>For the students measure it is the July schools roll returns.</p>

Name in data cube:	Gender
Definition:	The gender of each student.
Values:	Male; Female.
Context:	
Source:	For the early leaving exemptions measure it is the early leaver request form submitted to the local office of the Ministry of Education. For the students measure it is the July schools roll returns.

School

Name in data cube:	School
Definition:	The school of the students receiving an early leaving exemption (at the time of receiving the exemption).
Values:	<p>All schools that had a 15 year-old student as at 1 July for any of the years 2000 to 2004 inclusive; and Not Applicable.</p> <p>See Appendix One for a full list of all schools included in this data cube.</p> <p>A value of 'Not Applicable' for the early leaving exemptions measure indicates either:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• a school cannot be accurately identified from the data collection, though the corresponding student numbers for these schools will have been accurately captured in the July school roll return figures (albeit they cannot be identified)• the student was without a "Last school attended" on their early leaving exemption record - this may be because they were either: home schooled; newly arrived in NZ (so never been to school here); or were a truant (i.e. not enrolled at school when the exemption was granted).

School Gender

Name in data cube:	School_gender
Definition:	The gender of the students that the school caters for.
Values:	<p>Co-ed which equals co-education; Single Sex (Boys School); Single Sex (Girls School); Senior Co-ed, Junior Boys; Primary Co-ed, Secondary Girls; and Not Applicable.</p> <p>A value of 'Not Applicable' for the early leaving exemptions measure indicates that school gender cannot be assigned. This is due to either:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• a school cannot be accurately identified from the data collection, though the corresponding student numbers for these schools will have been accurately captured in the July school roll return figures (albeit they cannot be identified)• the student was without a "Last school attended" on their early leaving exemption record - this may be because they were either: home schooled; newly arrived in NZ (so never been to school here); or were a truant (i.e. not enrolled at school when the exemption was granted). <p>A value of 'Not Applicable' for the students measure indicates school gender was not known. Two schools had a school gender status of unknown between 2000 and 2003 (with a total of 7 fifteen year-old students during this time period and no early leaving exemptions). These schools were recorded as Co-ed from 2004 on.</p>
Context:	The Correspondence School is Co-ed.
Source:	July schools roll returns.

School Region

Name in data cube: School_Region

Definition: The Regional Council area each school is located in.

Values: New Zealand is divided into 16 regions; and Not Applicable.

See Appendix Two for a full list of Regional Councils.

A value of 'Not Applicable' for the early leaving exemptions and students measures indicates that school region cannot be assigned. This is due to either:

- a school cannot be accurately identified from the data collection, though the corresponding student numbers for these schools will have been accurately captured in the July school roll return figures (albeit they cannot be identified)
- the student was without a "Last school attended" on their early leaving exemption record - this may be because they were either: home schooled; newly arrived in NZ (so never been to school here); or were a truant (i.e. not enrolled at school when the exemption was granted)
- the exemption was from the Correspondence School or the Westmount School campus (from 2004 on).

School Socio-Economic Decile

Name in data cube:	Decile
Definition:	The decile of the socio-economic mix of the school the student attended.
Values:	<p>Decile 01; Decile 02; Decile 03; Decile 04; Decile 05; Decile 06; Decile 07; Decile 08; Decile 09; Decile 10; and Not Applicable.</p> <p>A value of 'Not Applicable' for the early leaving exemptions and students measures indicates that decile cannot be assigned. This is due to either:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• a school cannot be accurately identified from the data collection, though the corresponding student numbers for these schools will have been accurately captured in the July school roll return figures (albeit they cannot be identified)• the student was without a "Last school attended" on their early leaving exemption record - this may be because they were either: home schooled; newly arrived in NZ (so never been to school here); or were a truant (i.e. not enrolled at school when the exemption was granted)• the exemption was from the Correspondence School• the exemption was from a school that has not provided data to allow the calculation of deciles (these are predominantly private schools).
Context:	<p>The extent to which the school draws its students from low socio-economic communities. Uses the new school decile methodology which excludes an adjustment for the percentage of Māori; Pasifika; and English for Speakers of Other Languages eligible refugee students on each school roll. Decile 01 schools are the 10% of schools with the highest proportion of students from low socio-economic communities, whereas Decile 10 schools are the 10% of schools with the lowest proportion of these students. Deciles have also been aggregated into Quintiles.</p>

The Ministry of Education calculates SES decile scores from 5 Census elements: Household income; Occupation; Household crowding; Educational qualifications; and Income support.

School Socio-Economic Quintile

Name in data cube:	Quintile
Definition:	The quintile of the socio-economic mix of the school the student attended.
Values:	<p>Quintile 01; Quintile 02; Quintile 03; Quintile 04; Quintile 05; and Not Applicable.</p> <p>A value of 'Not Applicable' for the early leaving exemptions and students measures indicates that quintile cannot be assigned. This is due to either:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• a school cannot be accurately identified from the data collection, though the corresponding student numbers for these schools will have been accurately captured in the July school roll return figures (albeit they cannot be identified)• the student was without a "Last school attended" on their early leaving exemption record - this may be because they were either: home schooled; newly arrived in NZ (so never been to school here); or were a truant (i.e. not enrolled at school when the exemption was granted)• the exemption was from the Correspondence School• the exemption was from a school that has not provided data to allow the calculation of quintiles (these are predominantly private).
Context:	<p>The extent to which the school draws its students from low socio-economic communities. Uses the new school decile methodology which excludes an adjustment for the percentage of Māori; Pasifika; and English for Speakers of Other Languages eligible refugee students on each school roll. Quintile 01 schools are the 20% of schools with the highest proportion of students from low socio-economic communities (Decile 01 plus Decile 02), whereas Quintile 05 schools are the 20% of schools with the lowest proportion of these students (Decile 09 plus Decile 10).</p> <p>Quintiles have also been disaggregated into Deciles.</p>

Source:

The Ministry of Education calculates SES decile scores for each school from 5 Census elements: Household income; Occupation; Household crowding; Educational qualifications; and Income support. These are aggregated to form quintile scores.

School Territorial Local Authority

Name in data cube:	School_TLA
Definition:	The Territorial Local Authority (TLA) each school is located in.
Values:	<p>New Zealand is divided into 74 TLAs (16 cities (population > 30,000) and 58 districts); and Not Applicable.</p> <p>See Appendix Three for a full list of TLAs.</p> <p>A value of 'Not Applicable' for the early leaving exemptions and students measures indicates that school TLA cannot be assigned. This is due to either:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• a school cannot be accurately identified from the data collection, though the corresponding student numbers for these schools will have been accurately captured in the July school roll return figures (albeit they cannot be identified)• the student was without a "Last school attended" on their early leaving exemption record - this may be because they were either: home schooled; newly arrived in NZ (so never been to school here); or were a truant (i.e. not enrolled at school when the exemption was granted)• the exemption was from the Correspondence School or the Westmount School campus (from 2004 on).
Context:	<p>A Statistics New Zealand geographic classification. Also known as territorial authorities.</p> <p>TLA boundaries are defined by aggregations of area units.</p>
Source:	Assigned to each school from information from the July schools roll returns.

School Type

Name in data cube: School sector

Definition:

Values: Composite; Primary; Secondary; Special; and Not Applicable.

A value of 'Not Applicable' for the early leaving exemptions measure indicates that school type cannot be assigned. This is due to either:

- a school cannot be accurately identified from the data collection, though the corresponding student numbers for these schools will have been accurately captured in the July school roll return figures (albeit they cannot be identified)
- the student was without a "Last school attended" on their early leaving exemption record - this may be because they were either: home schooled; newly arrived in NZ (so never been to school here); or were a truant (i.e. not enrolled at school when the exemption was granted).

Source: Assigned to each school from information from the July schools roll returns.

School Urban Classification

Name in data cube:	Urban_rural
Definition:	The urban classification of the area unit each school is located in.
Values:	<p>Main Urban; Secondary Urban; Minor Urban; Rural; and Not Applicable.</p> <p>A value of 'Not Applicable' for the early leaving exemptions and students measures indicates that urban classification cannot be assigned. This is due to either:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• a school cannot be accurately identified from the data collection, though the corresponding student numbers for these schools will have been accurately captured in the July school roll return figures (albeit they cannot be identified)• the student was without a "Last school attended" on their early leaving exemption record - this may be because they were either: home schooled; newly arrived in NZ (so never been to school here); or were a truant (i.e. not enrolled at school when the exemption was granted)• the exemption was from the Correspondence School or the Westmount School campus (from 2004 on). <p>Three other schools have changed urban classification status of between 2000 and 2003. No early leaving exemptions were attributed to these schools and 4 fifteen year-old students were recorded as Not Applicable during these years.</p>
Context:	<p>A Statistics New Zealand geographic classification. Urban areas and rural areas are statistically defined areas (using complete area units) with no administrative or legal basis.</p> <p>There is a three part hierarchical sub-division of urban areas into:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• main urban areas: very large urban areas with a minimum population of 30,000 and centred on a city or major urban centre• secondary urban areas: have a population between 10,000 and 29,999 and are centred on the larger regional centres• minor urban areas: centred around smaller towns with a population between 1,000 and 9,999. <p>All remaining area units are considered rural.</p>
